

**SAFE STREETS AND ROADS FOR ALL GRANT PROGRAM (FISCAL YEAR 2022)
FLORENCE-FIRESTONE FOR ALL: ACHIEVING VISION ZERO IN
SOUTH LOS ANGELES**

Scope of Work

Los Angeles County was awarded \$21.49 million in United States Department of Transportation (USDOT)'s Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Federal funding to implement a series of traffic safety measures in the unincorporated community of Florence-Firestone.

The Project includes proven, cost-effective safety enhancements that will be implemented with a mix of physical improvements, supplemental planning, and educational measures focused on a community disproportionately impacted by traffic crashes. The Project consists of

- **Installing infrastructure designed to reduce crash severity and protect pedestrians**, such as high-visibility crosswalks, curb extensions, pedestrian head-start crossings, and other proven traffic calming measures.
- **Planning and demonstrating complete streets and safety elements** along Nadeau St and Compton Av to obtain community feedback on potential safety enhancements.
- **Launching a *Safe Streets for Seniors Program*** to work with seniors on enhancing safety along their most traveled routes.
- **Launching a *Teen Motor Vehicle Safety Program*** to address risky driving behaviors.
- **Implementing arts-based strategies to build support** for traffic safety and one or more new public art projects to support Vision Zero goals.
- **Conducting supplemental Vision Zero data analyses and planning** to identify inequities among those involved in traffic crashes to inform interventions.

Schedule/Status (tentative)

- May 7, 2024 – Board of Supervisors adopted a motion to accept grant funds
- May 20, 2024 – Funding agreement with USDOT executed
- July 1, 2024 – Amended grant agreement sent to United States Department of Transportation (currently pending Federal Highway Administration review)
- Spring 2025 – Safety program community engagement begins
- Spring 2029 – Infrastructure construction completed

A full project schedule, website, and community engagement plan is currently being developed.

Budget/Funding Source

The total project budget is estimated at \$26,868,331. A total of \$5,373,666 match will be funded through the Road Maintenance & Rehabilitation Account, which was created through Senate Bill 1, Chapter 5, Statutes of 2017.

Location

The Project is located in the unincorporated Florence-Firestone community, primarily along 92nd St, Alameda St, and Firestone Bl. Additionally, the Project will include demonstration projects on Nadeau St and Compton Av to collect community input on potential traffic safety enhancements on the streets.
