



IMPLEMENTATION OF VISION ZERO ON MULHOLLAND HIGHWAY PROJECT MILESTONES

Mulholland Highway Closure Lifted - December 2, 2025

Los Angeles County Public Works has completed repairs of the roadway and the closure was lifted on December 2, 2025.

In preparation, Public Works implemented traffic safety enhancements for the following locations as informed by residents and the broader community as areas of concern:

- Seminole Overlook
- Seminole Drive
- Sierra Creek Road
- Careful Avenue

Traffic calming measures for these locations include:

- Flashing LED signs
- Traverse rumble strips
- Hardened centerlines
